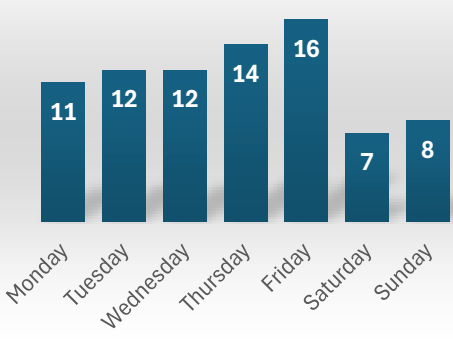

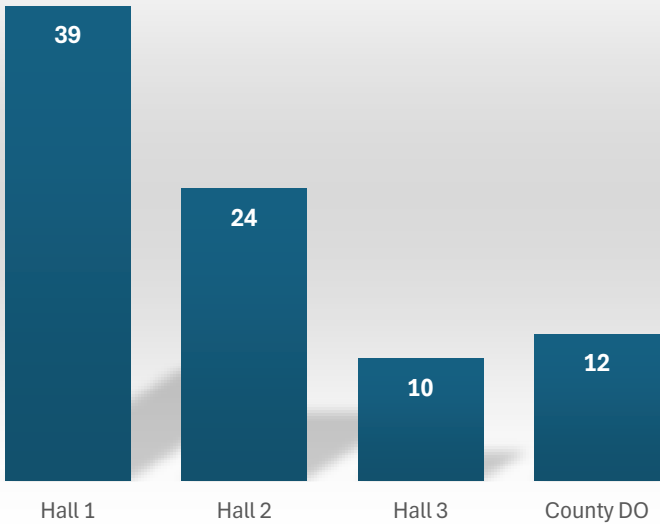

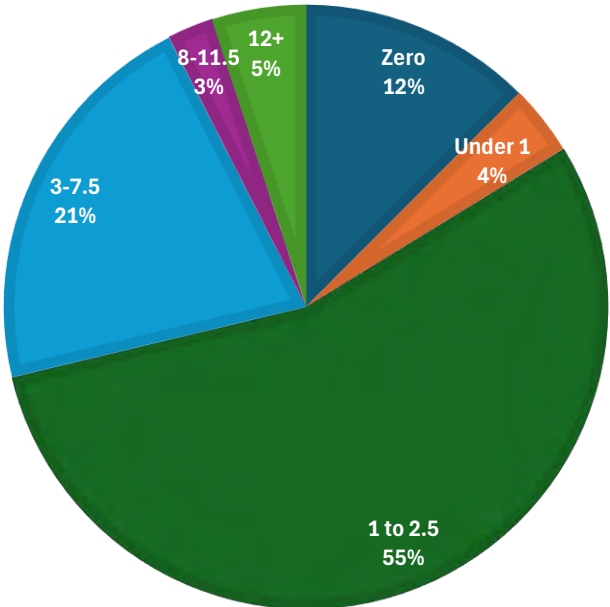

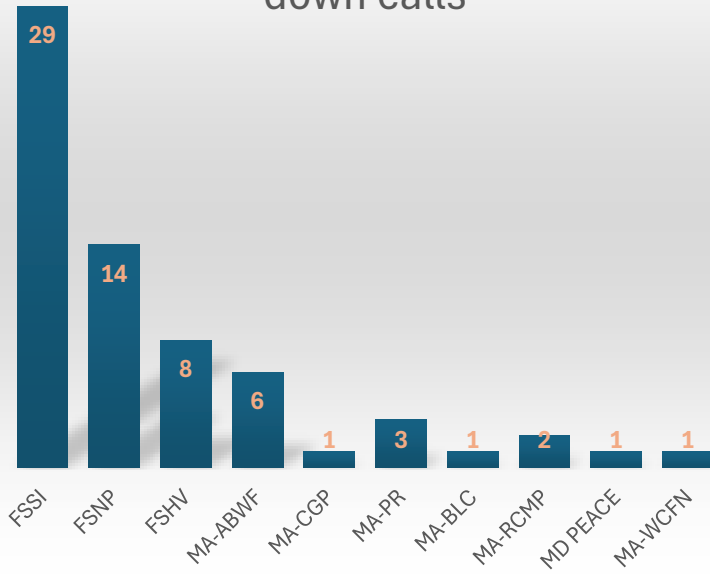
NUMBER OF RESPONSES BY HALL



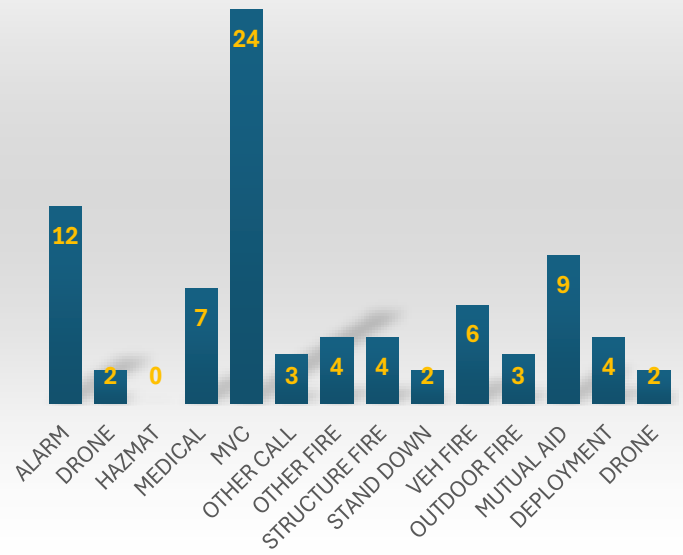
CALL DURATION (HOURS)

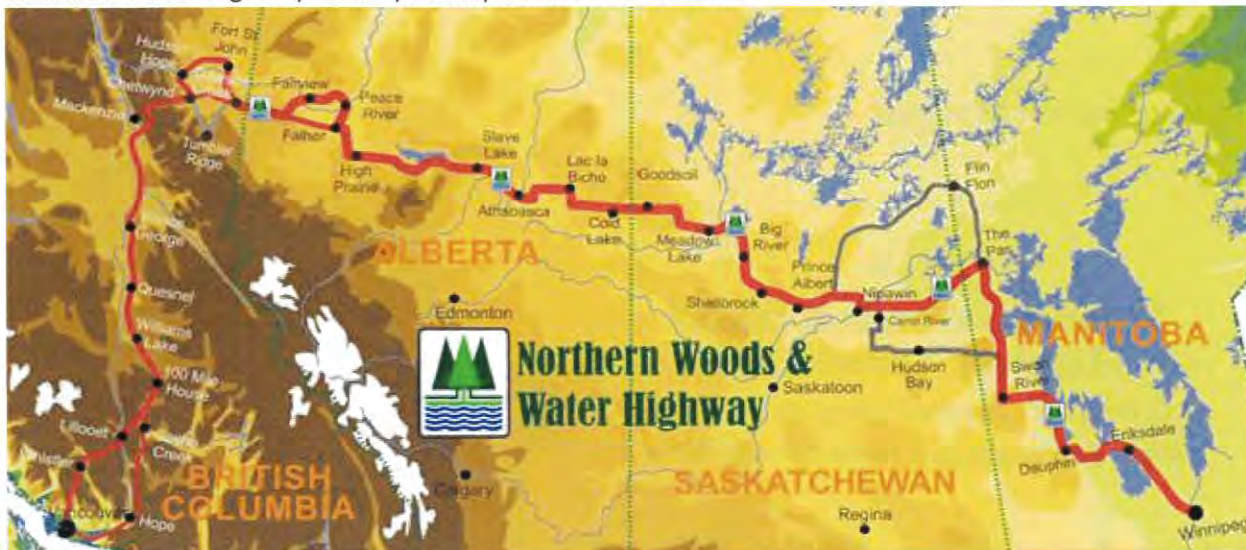

Re: Membership for Northern Woods & Water Highway Association

The Northern Woods & Water Highway is a group of small municipalities and businesses located along the Northern Woods & Water Highway which you may not be familiar with.



The concept for the highway was developed in the mid-1970s as a holiday route and as a transportation corridor for northern goods. The association was formed, and the three provinces recognized and signed the highway. The Highway officially runs from Winnipeg to Dawson Creek across northern Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and Alberta. Our Association is striving to extend the highway's reach by going through the province of British Columbia and getting it recognized and signed with our name & logo. The acknowledgment by the British Columbia government would generate the opportunity to market the highway as the 3rd Trans-Canada Highway. This would enhance the tourism economy in all the communities along the highway, thus bringing opportunities and benefits to local businesses and residents.

The Association was revived in 2016 following a hiatus of some 25 years. Since then, we have produced and distributed over 160,000 copies of our highway guide, attended several RV tradeshow, had articles published in several RV newsletters crossing Canada and the US. We developed a website www.nwwr.ca and created videos about the highway experience. We support the Gateway Keewatin Corridor group in their efforts to have the last portion of our highway, between Nipawin & The Pas, developed to an all-season road and eventually paved to facilitate the use of the Port of Churchill for the export of northern goods. The economic engine of the northern communities is predominantly forestry, with oil & gas, hydro electricity, agriculture and mining, with an underdeveloped tourism opportunity.

In 2025 we restarted guided cavalcades to take groups of travelers along the highway each summer. We are working on bi-directional groups that would stay in some of the communities twice each summer while we will strive to stop in different communities each year and the different directions. The Cavalcade will spend money in communities for camping, catered meals, fuel, golfing, and some regional attractions over each 21 day road trips. The Itinerary for 2026 bi-directional tours is on our website www.nwwrvtours.com. We also encourage self guided travel.

We are request for financial support through membership in our organization. This is to help finance RV trade shows, social media marketing and promotion of the highway. The Association receives no outside funding other than advertising and membership. This membership strengthens our lobby efforts for highway improvements with the four provinces. Membership is based upon community size. For example Village of Nampa with a population of 365 membership would be \$260.

Please present this request to Council for a decision.

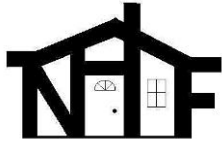

North Peace Housing Foundation Board Meeting Synopsis – December 3, 2025

Executive Director

Garden Court Update:

Pre-Action System Installation

Johnson Controls recently informed us that the project drawings are still pending, which was unexpected and disappointing. Based on previous communication from the sales representative, we had understood that the drawings were already completed and that only material and permitting timelines were outstanding. The installation was described as straightforward, requiring approximately one week for electrical work and one day for mechanical work.

Given this new information, we are awaiting an updated timeline for the completion of drawings so the project can proceed as planned.

Even more disappointing is the update that there is approximately 8-12 weeks lead time for materials.

Asset Transfers:

The Foundation has received Affidavits Re Value Land for the 27 Asset Transfer Units, allowing the Province to transfer title.

Nominal Sum Properties:

No update to report.

SRHI (Sustainable Remote Housing Initiative) - Cadotte Lake:

The 4 remaining units are in the process of being appraised and will be posted for sale once we receive the final report from the appraiser.

The lots for 2 previously sold units have been reclaimed and turned back to Northern Sunrise County. The remaining lots will be cleaned up once the units are sold and moved off site.



Westview – Fairview Development Committee:

No update to report.

Del-Air Lodge Redevelopment:

On Friday, November 21, 2025, NPHF completed a walkthrough of the Del-Air Lodge and Aurora Place (Continuing Care) with Chandos Construction and Alberta Assisted Living and Social Services. Below is a list of deficiencies that require completion.

The items highlighted in green have been completed; items that have a completion date are to be completed before Chandos' technician leaves the site. Anything without a completion date is being worked on with relevant subtrades or is being investigated; Chandos expects to have all necessary items completed before December 4, 2025, the end of the warranty period.

Board Actions:

The Board directed that Administration purchase one ARJO Alenti tub chair with integrated scale, for the purchase price of \$16,921.15, plus GST, to be ordered by December 4, 2025, taking advantage of the discounted pricing.

The Board directed that the Lodge Budget be approved with requisitions set at \$3,715,436.00 which is a 0% increase from last year as this level is sufficient to meet anticipated operational and capital maintenance needs while minimizing the impact on region property taxpayers.

FAMILY & COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES (FCSS)

YOUTH PROGRAMMING

ADULT 101

In 2025, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS, in partnership with the Peace Region Family Resource Network, hosted Adulting 101 sessions for youth aged 14 and older. These workshops provided practical life-building skills to prepare participants for adulthood. Youth learned essential vehicle maintenance with Integra Tire and investment and budgeting strategies with Sun Life Financial, gaining hands-on knowledge to confidently manage everyday responsibilities.

FALL INTO SCHOOL TEEN DANCE

In September, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS partnered with the Economic Development Officer and the Northern Sunrise County Youth Council to host a Teen Dance for youth aged 14 and older. The event featured a live DJ, a candy and popcorn bar, lemonade from Lemonology, and door prizes, providing a fun and safe environment for teens to socialize and enjoy an evening of music and community.

HOME ALONE

In 2025, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS hosted two Home Alone Workshops designed for youth aged 9 to 11. This workshop equips children with the skills and knowledge to safely and confidently stay at home alone for short periods. Through engaging activities and discussions, participants learn about personal safety, emergency preparedness, and making responsible decisions while fostering independence and self-assurance.

KIDZ KONNECTION

Kidz Konnection is an after-school program in the community of Nampa, designed to engage and connect school-aged children in a fun and supportive environment. Participants enjoy a wide range of themed crafts, games, and activities that promote creativity, teamwork, and personal development. The program also includes team-building initiatives and provides light snacks and refreshments, creating a welcoming space for youth to socialize, learn, and thrive.

MOMMY & ME CAKE CRAFT NIGHT

In 2025, St. Isidore FCSS hosted a wood craft workshop designed for mother figures and their children aged 8 and older. Participants received pre-cut wooden pieces to create a highland cow with interchangeable seasonal hats, along with decorating supplies, step-by-step instructions, and light refreshments. The workshop offered a hands-on, creative experience aimed at fostering meaningful connections between mother figures and their children while introducing them to a new crafting skill in a fun and supportive environment.

PARENTING PROGRAMS

In 2025, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS offered parent and tot based programs in Nampa (Little Adventurers) and in St. Isidore (La Petite École). These programs allow parents to learn how to play with their child and enhance early developmental skills. Parents and their children were able to explore different themes each month (Snore On - hibernating animals, We Go Together Like...- Valentine's Day, Dino-mite - dinosaur theme, Egg-stra Adorable - Easter theme, Seas the Day - under the sea theme, Gourd Vibes Only - Thanksgiving, Zoo-pur Fun - zoo animals, Oh Snap! - Gingerbread theme). Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS also partnered up with the Peace Region Family Resource Network to offer Pop Up Plays at Cecil Thompson Park, Marie Reine Playground, and Mill Brown Park. Parents and children were able to come together for interactive play while exploring playgrounds and green spaces located within the County and Village during the summer months. They also partnered to host several Parent Pit Stop programs in Marie Reine to provide a space for parent and youth to bond over themed activities.

FAMILY & COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES (FCSS)

YOUTH PROGRAMMING

SMART RISK

This year, Alberta Health Services Health Promotions coordinated SMART RISK, a full-day program for grade 7 and 8 students in Peace River and Grimshaw. The program provided engaging psychosocial education designed to help youth make informed, responsible decisions. Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS participated with an information booth at TA Norris and Glenmary High School, highlighting the variety of youth programs and services available to support their growth, well-being, and community involvement.

TEDDY BEAR PICNIC

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS partnered with the Peace Region Family Resource Network for their 9th Annual Teddy Bear Picnic on June 11-12, 2025. The event is designed for children ages 0-6, their parents/guardians, and their favourite stuffed friend. Participants explore interactive booths and engage in activities with their stuffed friends, while parents are able to gather parenting resources to help support the healthy growth of their child.

TEEN DRIVER SAFETY NIGHT

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS partnered with Northern Sunrise Rural Crime Watch, the RCMP, Alberta Health Services – Health Promotions, and the Peace Region Family Resource Network to host a Teen Driver Safety Night in St. Isidore. The session, open to teens and their parents, provided valuable information on safe driving practices, risk prevention, and road safety. Participants gained practical tips, resources, and insights to help young drivers make responsible decisions behind the wheel.

YOUTH SUMMER CAMPS

In 2025, Nampa Community Services coordinated two summer camps for children ages 6-9. Flip Flop Frolics was coordinated in July. Participants enjoyed three days of interactive activities, including tie dye crafting, playing at the bouncy pillow in Marie Reine, BBQ at Murphy's Flats, exploring Down to Earth Petting Zoo, Winagami Provincial Park, swimming at the High Prairie Aquatic Centre, and sweet treats daily. Sunshine Shenanigans was coordinated in August. Participants enjoyed three days of interactive activities, including tie dye crafting, exploring the Lac Cardinal Pioneer Village, swimming at the Grimshaw outdoor pool, a BBQ at Figure Eight Lake where they played on kayaks and paddleboards, swimming at the Greenview Regional Multiplex, and cool treats daily.



FAMILY & COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES (FCSS)

COMMUNITY PROGRAMMING

BRAIN ARCHITECTURE GAME

The Brain Architecture Game, offered in partnership with Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS and the Peace Region Family Resource Network, is an interactive learning activity that helps participants understand how early experiences shape brain development. Through hands-on play, participants explore the building blocks of healthy brain growth and learn strategies to support strong social, emotional, and cognitive development in children.

BLANKET EXERCISE

In September, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County Community Services partnered with the Peace River Aboriginal Interagency to host a Blanket Exercise in recognition of the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. This interactive program guided participants through key moments in Indigenous history, helping them understand the impacts of colonization, residential schools, and systemic discrimination. Participants gained a deeper awareness of Indigenous experiences and the importance of reconciliation, fostering empathy, reflection, and a commitment to building stronger, respectful relationships within the community.

BUDDY UP CAMPAIGN

In 2025, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS coordinated the Buddy Up Campaign, during the month of June. Buddy Up is a men's suicide prevention communications campaign; a call to action to men, by men. For the month of June, posts specific to suicide, men's health, and having open, honest conversations with men, were shared on the County and Community Services social media pages. In addition to promoting the campaign, Buddy Up bundles were dispersed to local businesses which featured promotional material and resources that they were encouraged to display at their office spaces.

CANADA REVENUE AGENCY 1-1 SESSIONS

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS coordinated one-on-one sessions with the Canada Revenue Agency in both Nampa and St. Isidore. These personalized appointments provided residents with guidance on tax questions, filing assistance, and support navigating the CRA's services, helping community members access accurate information and complete their tax-related tasks with confidence.

CHRISTMAS GIFT CARD PROGRAM

Each December, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County Community Services receives donations from local organizations and individuals to purchase Christmas Gift Cards for those in need. Since 2014, gift cards have been purchased from local grocery stores and delivered to people in need through the mail in a Christmas card. The program is 100% anonymous. Community members are encouraged to refer those in need to the Community Services Department so that they are included on the Christmas Gift Card program list. In 2025, there were 50 households (108 individuals) that received a gift card and Christmas card courtesy of donations received from Northern Sunrise County, Village of Nampa, the Nampa Gospel Women's Ministries, and a variety of anonymous donors.



FAMILY & COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES (FCSS)

COMMUNITY PROGRAMMING

COMMUNITY BBQ'S

In 2025, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS hosted two community-wide BBQs to bring residents together. The July event, "Spend Some More Time Together," took place at the Harmon Valley Campground, while the August "Community Meat Up" was held at the Murphy's Flats Day Use Area. Both events offered hot dogs, smokies, s'mores, and refreshments, providing a relaxed and enjoyable setting for neighbors to connect, socialize, and strengthen community bonds.

COMMUNITY PANTRY PROGRAM

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County Community Services has food shelves at their local office spaces to assist with collecting and dispersing non-perishable goods to individuals and families in need. The Community Pantry Program aims to assist individuals experiencing financial hardships and food insecurity.

COMMUNITY CRAFT NIGHTS

In 2025, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS hosted a variety of "Make and Take" workshops, offering hands-on creative experiences for the community. Workshops included traditional rattle making, traditional finger weaving, suncatcher creation, two paper flower sessions (spring and Christmas themed), and a pierogi making workshop. Participants had the opportunity to learn new skills, explore cultural and seasonal crafts, connect with other community members, and take home their handmade creations.

FAMILY DAY CELEBRATION

A Family Day Celebration is held annually in Nampa. Nampa Community Services coordinated a Family Day Celebration at the Nampa & District Complex. Participants were able to skate for free, roast hot dogs over an open fire, snowshoe, play in the snow piles, and connect with other families in the region.

FAMILY DODGE BALL

In 2025, St. Isidore Community Services and Nampa Community Services coordinated family dodge ball evenings at the St. Isidore Cultural Centre Gymnasium and the Nampa Public School Gymnasium. The goal was to get families active with one another and within their community.

FAMILY SKATE

In 2025, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County partnered with the Harmon Valley Fire Fighter Association to host a Family Skate and Wiener Roast at the newly developed skating pond near the Harmon Valley Fire Hall. Participants enjoyed an afternoon of skating, roasting hot dogs, indulging in mini brownies, and sipping hot chocolate, creating a fun and festive community gathering for families.

FATHER'S DAY FISHING DERBY

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS partnered with Rendez Vous Campground to host a free, non-competitive Father's Day Fishing Derby. Families pre-registered for a one-hour fishing time slot, enjoyed self-guided games, and had the chance to enter for door prizes. A complimentary BBQ was also provided, creating a fun and relaxed way for families to celebrate Father's Day together.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMMING

HALLOWEEN CELEBRATIONS

Halloween Celebrations were held in Nampa, and St. Isidore in 2025.

Nampa Community Services hosted a Monster Mash Family Dance on October 18, 2025, at the Nampa Golden Pioneers Drop-in Centre. Participants enjoyed a DJ dance, spot dance challenges, door prizes, and Halloween themed snacks.

St. Isidore Community Services partnered with the St. Isidore Cultural Committee to host a Halloween Goblin' & Go event in the Cultural Centre parking lot on October 31, 2025. Participants received goodie bags, hot chocolate, and hot dogs.

HALLOWEEN COSTUME SWAP

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS hosted a Halloween Costume Swap from October 1-31, 2025. The goal of the program is to ensure that kids in the Village of Nampa and Northern Sunrise County have a Halloween costume so that they can participate in the holiday, barrier-free. Nampa FCSS collects and disperses gently used Halloween costumes to families in need.

HARVEST FAMILY DANCE

St. Isidore Community Services partnered with the St. Isidore Cultural Centre to host a free family dance at the St. Isidore Cultural Centre Gazebo on September 27, 2025. Families were able to connect while enjoying snacks and a coordinated dance.

HOW SEX CHANGES AS WE AGE PRESENTATION

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS partnered with Danielle Laflamme of H.U.M.P.S.S to host "How Sex Changes as We Age," an informative session for women exploring the physical, emotional, and relational changes that can occur over time. Participants gained knowledge, practical tips, and strategies to maintain sexual health and intimacy throughout different stages of life in a safe and supportive environment.

JUST IN CASE

The Just in Case program was launched in January 2023. The program assists residents with preparing the documents and information they will need in case they or a family member have a sudden death or emergency. The form holds no documents; instead, it lists where to find your important documents. The forms were made available in paper and digital formats.

MAD HATTER'S MENTAL HEALTH TEA

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS partnered with About U to host a Mad Hatter themed afternoon tea in honour of World Mental Health Day, on October 10. The event gave participants the opportunity to connect with one another, create a space to have conversations about mental health and to gather local mental health resources and supports.

MARCHE FAMILIAL

In 2025, St. Isidore Community Services partnered with the St. Isidore Cultural Centre to host the annual Marche Familial (Family Run). Families are encouraged to walk, run, or push strollers along the pathways in St. Isidore. After the walk, participants are treated to hot dogs and light refreshments.



FAMILY & COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES (FCSS)

COMMUNITY PROGRAMMING

ONLINE SAFETY PRESENTATION

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS hosted the ALERT ICE Team for a free online safety presentation for both adults and youth. The event included information booths from a variety of organizations, providing resources and guidance to help families navigate the digital world safely. Participants learned about online risks, safe practices, and strategies to protect themselves and their children while using technology.

SCAM ALERT PRESENTATION

In November, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County coordinated a Scam Alert presentation with Julie Matthews. Participants learned about common scams, how to recognize warning signs, and practical strategies to protect themselves and their personal information from fraud. The session provided valuable tools to stay safe in both online and everyday transactions.

TECH TALK

In 2025, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County coordinated the Tech Talk program in both St. Isidore and Nampa. The Tech Talk program creates a space for residents to ask questions and learn how to better use their smart phones, tablets, and computers.

THE GIVING TREE

Each November, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS collects new and gently used mittens, toques, and coats for the Giving Tree program. The items received are dispersed to individuals and families in need.

VOLUNTEER APPRECIATION

Residents of Northern Sunrise County and the Village of Nampa were encouraged to nominate local youth volunteers in their communities. Seven youth received a special Volunteer Appreciation Award to recognize their contributions to the community.

To celebrate the volunteers within the County and Village, Community Services coordinated a Volunteer Appreciation BBQ at the St. Isidore Fire Hall during Volunteer Week in April. Volunteers were recognized, enjoyed a free BBQ, and were able to put their names in for a variety of door prizes.

VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX PROGRAM

The Volunteer Income Tax Program is for low income seniors (55 and older), persons with disabilities, and individuals with modest income.

In 2025, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County Community Services applied to host income tax preparation clinics for the Community Volunteer Income Tax Program with Canada Revenue Agency. The clinic ran from March 3 –April 30, 2025, and it assisted 104 residents with completing their 2024 tax returns.

WELCOME WAGON

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS coordinated the Welcome Wagon program in 2025. Welcome Wagon bundles are distributed to new community members, to make them feel welcomed and to let them know all about our amazing communities. They feature local and regional resources, along with promotional items from a variety of organizations.

WORLD SUICIDE PREVENTION DAY BBQ

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS partnered with the Town of Peace River to host a BBQ in recognition of World Suicide Prevention Day, on September 10. The event was an opportunity for community members to learn more about mental health in the region and to connect directly with a variety of mental health organizations.

FAMILY & COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES (FCSS)

SENIORS PROGRAMMING

HOME SUPPORT PROGRAM

The Home Support program was established to assist families and individuals, seeking to create an environment conducive to the clients needs. The service is designed to promote well-being in our region by providing assistance in the household; enabling ill, disabled, or frail individuals to remain in their own homes and to age in place.

In 2025, the Home Support Program had two casual Home Support Coordinators and sixteen clients.

INTERGENERATIONAL PROGRAM

The Intergenerational program was initially established in 2022, by St. Isidore FCSS and the École des Quatre-Vents school. After much success, it was offered again in 2025. Students and seniors are brought together to connect through shared activities on a monthly basis. The program rotates between the St. Isidore Cultural Centre and at the École des Quatre-Vents school every other month.

INTERNATIONAL DAY OF OLDER PERSONS

The International Day of Older Persons is celebrated annually on October 1.

In 2025, a Seniors' Luncheon was held at the Nampa Sunrise Cafe in celebration of the day. Participants enjoyed a complimentary hot lunch, refreshments, door prizes, and were able to gather local resources and service information.

SENIORS' COFFEE MORNING

Seniors' Coffee Mornings were held in Nampa at Nampa Foods and Nampa Sunrise Café each month. The coffee program allows seniors to connect with other seniors while enjoying a free cup of coffee or tea.

SENIOR SPECIAL OUTINGS

In 2025, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County Community Services coordinated several outings for older adults, ages 55 and older. Senior outings allow people over the age of 55 to explore the Peace Region while connecting with their peers. Special senior outings coordinated in 2025 included the LAHF Dinner Theatre, Lucky Strike Bowling Alley, Flower Frenzy Greenhouse, Christie's Greenhouse, Fern's Greenhouse, Riverboat Cruise with Peace River Adventures, the Berry Ranch, Peace River Festival of Trees Senior Tea, Supper with Santa, and A Modern Day Christmas Miracle concert at Athabasca Hall.

SENIORS' WEEK EVENTS

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County strives to celebrate their seniors each year by hosting and attending Seniors' Week events throughout the Peace Region.

Nampa hosted a Seniors' Week Luncheon at the Heart River Golf Course, where they enjoyed a BBQ on the patio, door prizes, and nine holes of golf.

St. Isidore Community Services hosted their annual Strawberry Tea, where participants enjoyed tea, sweet treats, and socializing with their peers. They also coordinated a River Boat outing with Peace River Adventures.



FAMILY & COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES (FCSS)

SENIORS PROGRAMMING

WHEELS TO MEALS & CAFÉ DU COIN HOT LUNCH PROGRAM

The Wheels to Meals program provides nutritious meals and promotes health, well-being, and independence for individuals. The program was offered every Monday, excluding stat holidays, until September, when the program was moved to Wednesdays. The Wheels to Meals program continued as a delivery program with the addition of an in-person meal component in March 2025. The in-person meals take place on the last Wednesday of the month. In 2025, the program was offered 48 times, and it served a total of 1,316 meals (508 pick up meals, 704 delivered meals and 104 in-house meals). The program served 53 residents and an average of 25 people each week. In 2025, the in-house presentations included: Credits and benefits for 65+ with the Canada Revenue Agency, positive mental health strategies with Recovery Alberta, local wildlife discussion with Fish & Wildlife, pre-planning with Peace Valley Funeral Home, managing prescriptions and flu clinic with Value Drug Mart, sound bathing experience with Lynn Florence, Nuclear impact assessment process with Impact Assessment Agency of Canada, and a Joys of Aging comedy show with Shawn Pittman.

The Seniors Hot Lunch Program also provides a nutritious food option for seniors that also promotes healthy eating, well-being and independence for individuals. The program is coordinated every Tuesday during the lunch hour, excluding June-August, and over the Christmas holidays. The Hot Lunch program is hosted at the Cafe du Coin and seniors have the option of ordering a take out or dine in meal. In 2025, the program was offered 33 times, and it served 744 meals (678 in-house meals and 66 take home meals) and served on average 22 people each week.



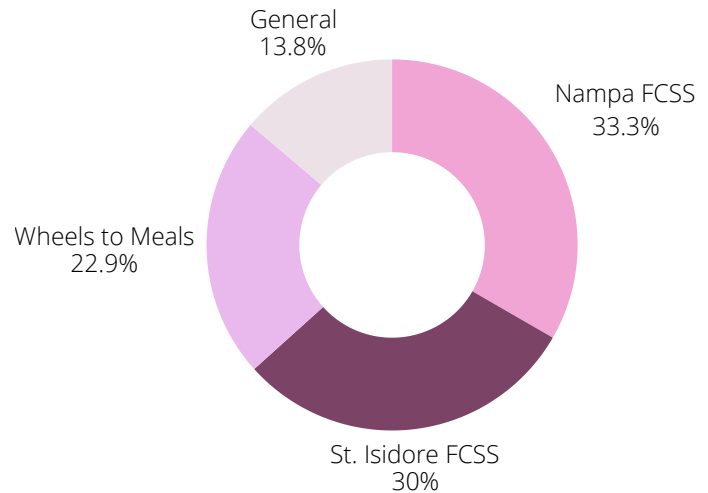

In 2025, there were 210 FCSS programs offered within Northern Sunrise County and the Village of Nampa with a total of 74 individual programs.

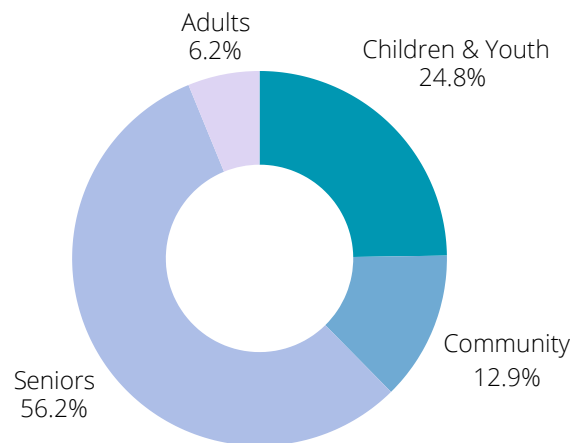

YOUTH PROGRAMMING

BIKE RODEOS

In 2025, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County Community Services organized two Bike Rodeos, held in both Nampa and St. Isidore. These events were delivered in partnership with the local RCMP, Alberta Health Services – Health Promotions, and the local Fire Departments. The Bike Rodeos provided youth with important bike safety education and helped them build confidence while riding in their communities.

END OF THE SUMMER YOUTH OUTING

In 2025, St. Isidore Community Services hosted an End of the Summer Youth Outing to the Eastlink Swimming Pool in Grande Prairie. Pre-teens and teens were invited to board the community van for an afternoon of swimming and connecting with their peers.

TINY TEETH

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County FCSS partnered with a Alberta Health Services Dental Health Professional to host a free Tiny Teeth Fluoride Varnish Clinic for pre-school children starting at age one. The parents and guardians were able to ask questions regarding proper teeth development and to discuss possible concerns.

YOUTH SPECIAL OUTINGS

In 2025, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County Community Services coordinated several outings for children and youth. Youth outings allow children and youth to explore the Peace Region while connecting with their peers. Recreational youth outings coordinated in 2025 included the EastLink Centre, Ace of Wars Laser Tag and the Corn Maze and Country Decor.

YOUTH VOLLEYBALL

During the summer months, St. Isidore Community Services coordinated youth drop-in volleyball evenings at the St. Isidore Cultural Centre held weekly for youth ages 9-16 years. Participants learned the basics of volleyball, practiced drills, and played games.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMMING

BATTLE OF THE BULBS

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County Community Services hosted a Christmas Light Up Challenge. Residents were invited to decorate their homes, apartments, or yards with lights, decorations, and inflatables for a chance to win one of four prizes. The themes included Festival of Colours, Winter Wonderland, O' Christmas Tree, and the Golden Glow Award for seniors.

BREAKFAST WITH THE BUNNY

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County Community Services partnered with the Harmon Valley Agricultural Society to host the Annual Breakfast with the Bunny event on April 19, 2025. Families enjoyed a complimentary pancake breakfast, took part in a variety of Easter-themed activities, including a Easter Egg Hunt, and had the opportunity to capture memorable photos with the Easter Bunny.

COMMUNITY CPR A WITH AED TRAINING

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County Community Services collaborated with Northern Sunrise County Protective Services to offer a free community CPR Level A with AED training session. This initiative aimed to equip residents with the knowledge and confidence needed to respond effectively in emergency situations where CPR could make a lifesaving difference.

RECREATION & CULTURE PROGRAMS

COMMUNITY PROGRAMMING

FARMERS DAY

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County Community Services coordinates the Annual Farmers Day event in June. The event is run in conjunction with the Farmers Day Baseball Tournament. In 2025, the event included inflatables, mini games, glitter tattoos, face painting, cotton candy and slushes. Due to cooler temperatures, there were approximately 230 people in attendance this year.

FOOD SAFETY COURSE

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County Community Services coordinated a Food Safety Course in partnership with Alberta Health Services. Participants learned essential skills for safely handling, preparing, and storing food, as well as how to prevent foodborne illnesses. The course also covered sanitation practices, proper cooking temperatures, cross-contamination prevention, and the importance of maintaining a clean and safe food environment, equipping attendees with the knowledge needed to confidently support community events, workplaces, and home kitchens.

MEDICINE & HERBAL WALK

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County Community Services partnered with the Green Goddess to host a Medicine and Herbal Walk. During the walk, participants explored the local environment and learned to identify a variety of naturally occurring medicines and herbs. They gained insight into the traditional uses, health benefits, and sustainable harvesting practices of these plants, as well as practical tips for incorporating them safely into daily wellness routines.

WINTER TRACKING & SUMMER WILDLIFE DAY

Nampa/Northern Sunrise County Community Services partnered with ALUS and SORA Ecological to host two outdoor learning experiences, one in the winter and one in the summer. Participants explored local forest areas to observe and track wildlife, learning to identify animal tracks, understand movement patterns, and recognize signs of resting or sleeping areas. The sessions also provided insight into seasonal behaviors, habitat use, and the ecological roles of different species, helping participants develop a deeper appreciation for local wildlife and the importance of preserving natural habitats.

REGIONAL PROGRAMMING

CONCERT SERIES

In 2025, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County Community Services joined forces with the Town of Peace River Recreation Department to host a summer concert series. Concerts were scheduled for June - September and held at a variety of outdoor spaces.

The first Concert Series was held on June 4, at the 12' Davis Events Park in Peace River and featured Jenna Loewen. The second Concert Series was held on July 9, at Cecil Thompson Park and featured George Brothers. The third Concert Series was scheduled for August 6, at Riverfront Park with Luke Lounsbury, however, due to inclement weather, the event was cancelled.

The final Concert Series was held on September 3, at Cecil Thompson Park, and featured music by They Call me Sir.

FRESH AIR CINEMA

In 2025, Nampa/Northern Sunrise County Community Services partnered with the Town of Peace River and Fresh Air Cinema to host a summer outdoor movie experience.

On August 8, the Fresh Air Cinema was held at the Peace River Fairgrounds. A double feature was coordinated. Participants enjoyed The Wild Robot, followed by Grown Ups. In addition to the movies, a variety of local food vendors were onsite serving fresh eats for participants. The Fresh Air Cinema attracted approximately 140 participants.

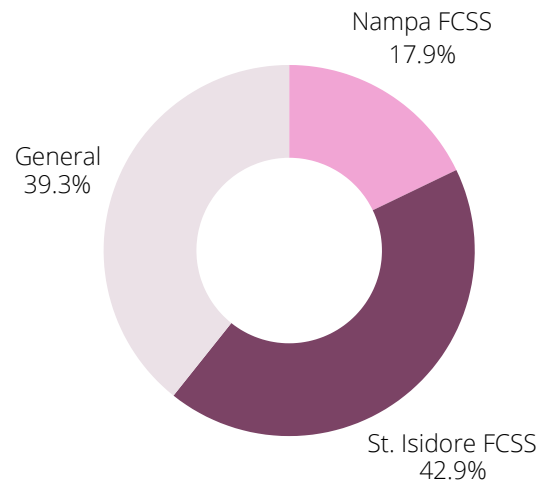

In 2025, there were 30 Recreation & Culture focused programs offered within Northern Sunrise County and the Village of Nampa with a total of 21 individual programs.

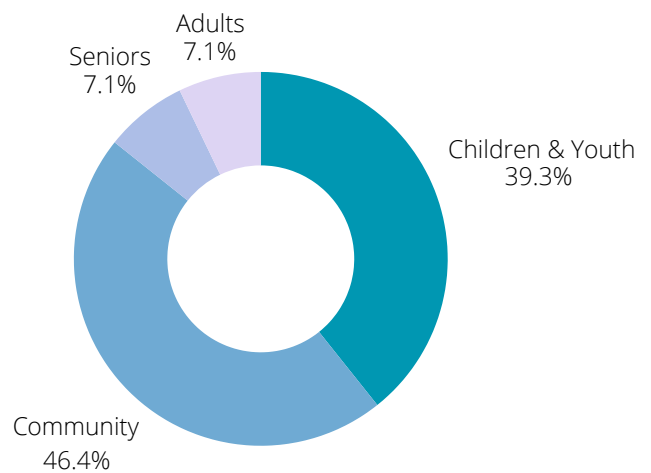

COMMUNITY VAN PROGRAM

The Community Services Van is for residents of the Village of Nampa and Northern Sunrise County. Seniors (55 and older) and individuals with mobility impairments are given priority.

However, the Community Van serves all ages.

The van costs \$5 to go to Peace River and \$20 for trips to Grande Prairie. Cost for specialty trips depends on the location and time spent travelling.

Third Monday of the month: St. Isidore to Grande Prairie

Second Friday of the month: Cadotte Lake to Grande Prairie

In 2025, there were 83 outings; 41 trips to Peace River from Nampa & St. Isidore area, 1 trips to Peace River from Cadotte Lake, 18 trips to Grande Prairie, 10 special outings for youth, 10 special outing for seniors, 2 intergenerational program outings, and 1 outing to Wheels to Meals. There was a total of 442 rides in 2025, with 110 unique riders (47 unique youth riders and 63 older adult unique riders).

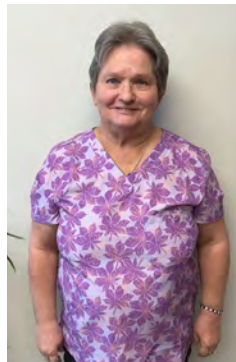

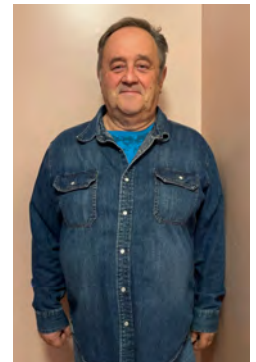
